## Grant Mitooka Given the Gift of Life

For Carrie and Joel Mitooka, the 2019 holiday season might have been very bleak. Instead, the family joyfully celebrated 2019 and rang in the New Year with renewed vigor, appreciation, and heartfelt gratitude for John Muir Health and the exceptional care team that saved their son's life.

At thirteen-months old, Grant was rushed via critical care transport from the family's local hospital to John Muir Health with what had begun as common Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV). "Grant was very, very sick and our local hospital wasn't able to provide the care he needed," says Carrie. "He was in grave condition and had it not been for exceptional physicians and nurses in John Muir Health's Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), my baby might not have survived."

Through a partnership with Stanford Children's Health, families can receive care for their children, close to home, at the only PICU in Contra Costa County.

RSV can be very serious, especially for infants. It can cause severe infections such as bronchiolitis, an inflammation of the small airways in the lung, and pneumonia, an infection of the lungs. Unfortunately, this was true for Grant and he would remain in John Muir Health's PICU for nearly one month.
"John Muir Health provided my son with the gift of life," says Carrie. "My entire family felt taken care of, too. Our many questions were answered immediately-and often times before they were even asked. The Child Life Specialists were phenomenal and provided the attention my other children needed when I couldn't provide it."

Carrie and Joel appreciate the care their children received so much that they gave hundreds of dollars in donated toys to John Muir Health's Child Life Services and nearly \$1,000 from an online Facebook Birthday Fundraiser.
"We will never forget the doctors, nurses and staff who saved our son and took such great care of all of us," says Joel. "This is our way of giving back."

Today, Grant is the epitome of good health. He learned to walk not long after he returned home and his family says they now have a difficult time keeping up with him!
